
Proposed points system for the 2019 autocross season

We will discuss AND vote to adopt these rules at the Jan. 10 CRSCCA meeting.

As far as numbers on cars go, we recommend but do not require easily readable magnetic or vinyl numbers and letters. You can still use tape if you must, but please bring your own, as the trailer has no tape.

Each car should have a number, its generic class letter (X, N, L, A,B,C,D, E or F) and its SCCA class letters, on both sides.

Example for a stock Subaru BRZ:
97
A DS

The A is for the CRSCCA class, the DS is for D Street, the SCCA category.

Note that this year, volunteers at approved CRSCCA events, including Green Prix and Street Survival, will get additional points that count towards the season championship.

Chattanooga Region SCCA (CRSCCA) SOLO CHAMPIONSHIP Points System 2019 – ver0.0

1. The 2019 Autocross Championship will use the CRSCCA Points System 2019 to calculate year end points to determine championships in each class category defined below (Section 6).
2. **CRSCCA Championship Points will ONLY be given to CRSCCA members, excluding competitors who compete in the *CRSCCA Autocross Novice Class Category*.**
The autocross championship season will consist of scheduled CRSCCA Autocross Events for the calendar year (expected to be eight (8) events). The Class Categories will be defined by the SCCA Solo/Autocross Rule Book (Current Published Edition). The finishing place in each group will be calculated by a specified SCCA autocrossing PAX index being applied to the raw time of the quickest timed run per official competition event. The competitors are responsible for correctly classifying their vehicle as defined by the SCCA Solo/Autocross Rule Book (Current Published Edition) when entering a CRSCCA autocross. CRSCCA members are responsible for registering in the correct PAX Class Category when registering online for a CRSCCA Event. Failing to register in a PAX Class Category, may result in NO Points being awarded for that event.
3. The **CRSSCA Points System 2019** is as follows:
 - A. 1st Place = 20 Points
 - B. 2nd Place = 16
 - C. 3rd Place = 13
 - D. 4th Place - 11

- E. 5th Place = 10
- F. 6th Place = 9
- G. 7th Place = 8
- H. 8th Place = 7
- I. 9th Place = 6
- J. 10th Place = 5
- K. 11th Place through Remaining Finishing Positions receive 4 Points

4. Timing and Scoring Chief will provide the Points Administrator with a copy of the Official Scoring Report to tabulate autocross championship points. The pointskeeper will update the current Championship Point standings after each CRSCCA AutoX in a timely fashion and provide them for posting on the CRSCCA website and on Facebook. The pointskeeper and/or Timing and Scoring Chief will post the latest Championship Point standings at each event.

5. CRSCCA SOLO 1st Place Championship Trophies will be awarded in each Class Category, to the CRSCCA member who accumulates the most points in each Class Category **with at least 6 different competitor entries throughout the year**. For Class Categories that **have** at least 12 **different competitor** entries throughout the year, the 2nd Place finisher will receive a 2nd Place Championship Trophy and for class Categories with at least 25 **different competitor** entries throughout the year, the 3rd Place finisher will receive a 3rd Place Championship Trophy. (Championship Points will follow the competition Class not the Driver.) **Solo Event** trophies may be awarded at each event based on the CRSCCA SOLO Championship Class Categories and will be given to CRSCCA and Non-CRSCCA members.

6. Bonus SOLO Championship Points maybe earned by competitors when volunteering and working approved CRSCCA events (i.e. TireRack Street Survival, Chattanooga Green prix and any other CRSCCA Board Approved Events). A list of volunteers eligible for bonus points will be given to the Championship Points Administrator (CPA) after each volunteer event. Competitors are responsible for ensuring that their eligible Volunteer Bonus Points have been applied to their SOLO Championship Points total. Volunteer Bonus Points do NOT carry over into the following seasons SOLO Championship. Volunteer Bonus Points will be 12 Bonus Points per each eligible event up to a Maximum of 48 Bonus Points per competitor per year. All Volunteer Bonus Points must be allocated or adjusted prior to the November Solo.

7. **CRSCCA Charity Solo Events: At the discretion of the CRSCCA board a Charity Solo Event may be held during the year in addition to the scheduled CRSCCA Solo Events. The Charity Solo Event will count as a Double Points CRSCCA Solo Event for the CRSCCA SOLO Championship.**

8. **The CRSCCA Solo schedule may have CRSCCA Championship Point events and Non-Points events throughout the year.**

9. **For CRSCCA Solo Events that are not able to publish an official T&C report for the Solo Event, the Solo Chair may award Solo Championship Points, to all Event participating competitors. Ten (10) Solo Championship Points will be given.**

10. Class Grouping Notes and Rules:

- A. ***Pro Class Category***: This class will be open to any competitor in any Class as defined by the current year's published SCCA Solo/Autocross Rules Book, except Junior Karting Classes. The 1st Place finisher will be awarded the 1st Place Pro Championship Trophy and be awarded the John Darrow Autocrosser of the Year Award. **Failing to register in a PAX Class Category, may result in NO Solo Championship Points being awarded for the**

event.

B. CRSCCA SOLO Novice Class Category: Non-SCCA, Non-CRSCCA, and New CRSCCA members are eligible for the Novice Class Category. Novice Class Category will include Classes as defined by the current year's published SCCA Solo/Autocross Rules Book, except Junior Karting Classes. To be eligible to win the CRSCCA Novice Class Category the competitor must be a CRSCCA member before the end of the season. Novice competitors may compete in the Novice Class Category for one (1) Novice Championship Season. Novices that ONLY compete in two (2) CRSCCA AutoX events in a Championship Season or a ¼ (25%) of a the scheduled CRSCCA AutoX events in the Championship Season, may petition the points administrator for a Competition Wavier to compete in the next year's CRSCCA Novice Championship. If a new competitor (Non-Member or CRSCCA Member) registers in any other Class Category and competes for SOLO Championship Points, is no longer eligible to compete in the CRSCCA SOLO Novice Championship. **Failing to register in a PAX Class Category, may result in NO Solo Championship Points being awarded for the event.**

C. CRSCCA Ladies Class Category: This Class Category is defined by placing all Ladies Classes as defined by the current year's published SCCA Solo/Autocross Rules Book (i.e. A Street Ladies, Street Touring S Ladies, B Street Prepared Ladies, Street Modified Ladies) into one Class grouping, except Junior Karting Classes. (The Ladies Class Category will use the same PAX index as all other Classes, there is NO special PAX index for this Category.) **Failing to register in a PAX Class Category, may result in NO Solo Championship Points being awarded for the event.**

D. Street - Street Touring Class Category: This Category is defined by the current year's published SCCA Solo/Autocross Rules Book for vehicles in the Street and Street Touring Classes. **Failing to register in a PAX Class Category, may result in NO Solo Championship Points being awarded for the event.**

E. Street Prepared – Street Modified Category: This Class Category is defined by the current year's published SCCA Solo/Autocross Rules Book for vehicles in the Street Prepared and Street Modified Classes. **Failing to register in a PAX Class Category, may result in NO Solo Championship Points being awarded for the event.**

F. Prepared-Modified Class Category: This Class Category is defined by the current year's published SCCA Solo/Autocross Rules Book for vehicles in the Prepared and Modified Classes. **Failing to register in a PAX Class Category, may result in NO Solo Championship Points being awarded for the event.**

G. Karting Class Category: This Class Category is defined by the current year's published SCCA Solo/Autocross Rules Book. **Failing to register in a PAX Class Category, may result in NO Solo Championship Points being awarded for the event.**

H. Classic American Muscle (CAM) Class Category: This Class is defined by the current year's published SCCA Solo/Autocross Rules Book for the CAM Class. **Failing to register in a PAX Class Category, may result in NO Solo Championship Points being awarded for the event.**

I. NOTES:

i. It is highly recommended that competitors competing in a Class with only one entry, use the SCCA Solo/Autocross Rules Class Bumping rule to move up to a Class with more competitors. *Class Bumping DOES NOT affect the competitor's vehicle Class PAX.*

ii. It is encouraged by the CRSCCA Solo Committee that the Class Champion in the following Class Categories, compete in the *Pro Class* the following year. The Class Categories are *Street / Street Touring, Street Prepared / Street Modified, Prepared / Modified, and Classic American Muscle (CAM) Class*

Categories.

11. The CRSCCA Solo Committee and/or CRSCCA Board will define the number of scheduled CRSCCA SOLO Events per CRSCCA Championship Point's Season. CRSCCA Solo Events will be conducted to the SCCA Solo/Autocross Rule Book (Published Edition) and/or CRSCCA Solo Supplements as defined by the CRSCCA Solo Committee and/or CRSCCA Board. The CRSCCA Solo Committee and/or CRSCCA Board will specify the PAX index that will be used. The CRSCCA Solo Championship Points Administrator will be a CRSCCA member who volunteers for the position for the CRSCCA SOLO Championship Season. The points administrator may be a competitor in the CRSCCA SOLO Championship Season. The CRSCCA Solo Committee and/or CRSCCA Board will be the final arbitrator for the CRSCCA SOLO Championship Points standings, in disputes between the CPA and any competitor when a competitor challenges the Points standings. All disputes must be addressed prior to the end of the CRSCCA SOLO Championship Season calendar year.

12. Any CRSCCA SOLO Championship Class Categories that end in a Tie will be resolved by finishing order and/or place of the competitors in their Class Category of the Last CRSCCA Solo Event.

13. If the last CRSCCA Solo Event is canceled, the current Championship Points standings will become the final CRSCCA SOLO Championship standings and Trophies will be awarded. Any ties in points will be resolved as described in Section 8.

Class Categories by Classes Eligible:

- i. Pro Class Category (X): All Classes eligible except Jr Karting Classes
- ii. Novice Class Category (N): All Classes eligible except Jr Karting Classes
- iii. Ladies Class Category (L): All Classes eligible except Jr Karting Classes
- iv. Street/Street Touring Category (A): Classes; SS, AS, BS, CS, DS, ES, FS, GS, HS, HCS, SSR, STC, STF, STS, STX, STR, STU, SSC, STH
- v. Street Prepared/Street Modified Class Category (B): Classes; SSP, ASP, BSP, CSP, DSP, ESP, FSP, SM, SMF, SSM
- vi. Prepared/Modified Class Category (C): Classes; XP, BP, CP, DP, EP, FP, GP, AM, BM, CM, DM, EM, FM
- vii. Classic American Muscle Class Category (D): Classes; CAM-T, CAM-C, CAM-S
- viii. Karting Class Category (E): Class KM only
- ix. Junior Karting Class Category (F): Classes JK-A, JK-B, JK-C
